Happy Holidays, Everyone!

The Candor Historical Society has had a busy year! We've had several great programs, an awesome fundraiser, and much of the renovation work on the History Center has been completed, although there is still more to be done.

We have owned the History Center for five years now, and our wonderful volunteers have faithfully met every Monday morning to read through and catalog the thousands upon thousands of articles, photographs, books, and other items that had been collected over the years and stored in various places around town. Several grants have helped us with renovations. Those completed so far are a new porch, a new basement entrance, insulation of the building, two new handicapped restrooms, new tables, file cabinets, a printer, a computer, and scanner.

Our file cabinets are brimming with information in many categories: Candor History, Annual Events, The School, Candor Businesses, Candor Organizations, Obituaries, Railroads, Maps, Social News, Town and Village Government, Military, Legal, Family Information on hundreds of local families, Candor Couriers and other newspapers, many genealogies, and much more.

We are not technically a museum but do have several small items that we display at various times. Our most recent display was on the veterans of Candor from the Revolutionary War to the present. This exhibit even traveled on Veteran's Day, making a well-received appearance at the Legion, and the next day it was a welcome presentation at the Veteran's Breakfast sponsored by the Baptist Church. We continue to seek names and stories of veterans.

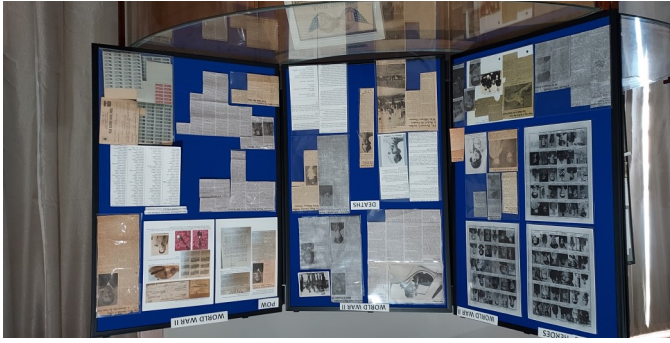
Two new exhibits at the Center are on the Grange, the organization that owned the building prior to the Historical Society, and on the Candor Fire Department. We also have on display the bell from St. Mary's Episcopal Church, which was located on Prospect Valley Road.

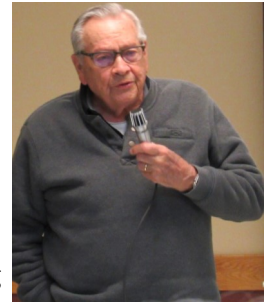
OVERVIEW OF OUR 2022 TALKS/EVENTS:

2/23: Angel Eyes Animal Rescue & Wildlife Rehabilitation’s Executive Director of Wildlife Division, Denise Liske of Willseyville gave a talk on being a NYS Department of Environmental Conservation Certified Wildlife Rehabilitator, and the AngelEyes Animal Rescue & Wildlife Rehabilitation Center that provides rescue, rehabilitation, transportation and professional care to distressed, displaced, injured or orphaned wildlife that are eventually released to their natural environments.

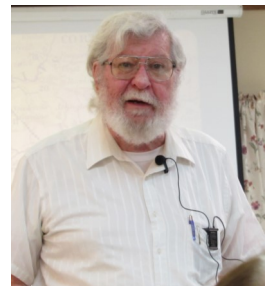
3/30: Historic Candor Market site in the Village of Candor by Historian Carol Henry, delved into the past when the location was once Young’s Hall, Candor Town Hall, Candor Opry House, and an assortment of grocery stores. From meeting rooms, to popular shows and entertainment, to basketball and a high school shooting range in the basement, these are a few of the events that went on between 1875 to the present at this historic location. Also included in this talk, Melvin Foster shared his memories of working at the Candor Market.



4/18: Bob Pantel shared his observations about bird species which have increased and decreased in Candor over his birding years, and some of the habitat changes driving these demographic shifts. Bob is a licensed bird bander who has worked for decades with the Eastern Bird Banding Association. He is currently the editor & production manager of The North American Bird Bander, a quarterly periodical.



5/25: Tom McEnteer talked on various notable people of Tioga County, recounting a few stories about people who had an impact far beyond our local area, including men, women, some of them business people, politicians; scientists, and military.

10/9: October Fall Festival Phil Jordan's Annual Maple Grove Cemetery Walk recounted tales of many of those buried there.



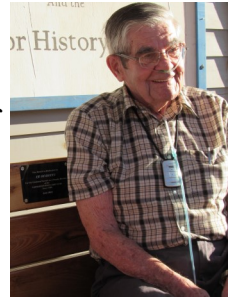
10/26: Talk Phil Jordan Gave a talk on his rendition of notable people that lived in Candor during his growing up years.
